

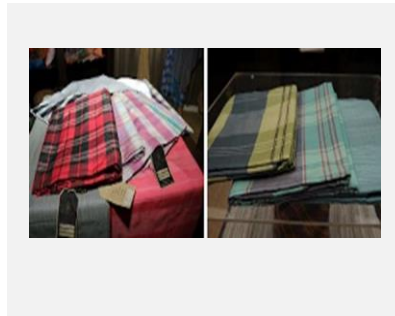
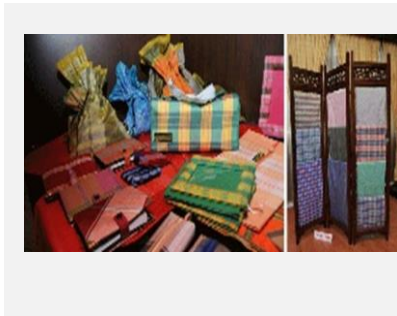

Main characteristics/features

Bario tenun Pahang diraja is a textile made of silk and is a famous Malay community tradition. It is worn during official functions. Besides being worn as kain sarong, sampin or scarf, tenun Pahang is also used to make ties, pencil cases, handbags and other items.

Geographical area

The geographical area is located in Pahang.

Production and processing

The process of making tenun Pahang diraja is as follows:

- separate the yarn;
- dye the thread;
- spin the thread;
- arrange the required pattern;
- insert the thread into the steel teeth;
- wind the thread around the wooden bobbins;
- separate the warp threads into upper and lower layers;
- weave in the required motifs and patterns.

Link between product and territory

Silk weaving in Pahang originated from the Malay people of Bugis descent. A high official of the Bugis, Keraing Aji, introduced the hand woven cloth to the people of Pekan, Pahang who later went on to create a very successful silk weaving industry.
