Main characteristics/features

Phurua Plateau Wine (Wine Ti Raab Soong Phu Rua) is made of fermented fresh grapes. The white wine is from the chenin blanc grape and has a golden amber colour while the red wine is from the shiraz grape and has a dark red colour. Both kinds of wine have a fine distinguished taste.

Production/processing

Link between product and territory

Phurua Plateau, Loei province, has heavy rain in the rainy season and gets a strong cool wind from the north in the winter. The soil suits the growth of grapevines very well. The top layer of soil is a sandy clay loam with skeletal soils and sandy silt beneath it. The soil characteristics allows for the grapevine roots to grow healthy and strong. These factors enhance the sweetness in the grapes which when combined with authentic wine making processes, produces high quality wine.
