Main characteristics/features

Ban Mon pottery (Krueng Pan Din Pao Ban Mon) is an unglazed type of pottery used in homes and for decoration. When it is fired, it turns an orange-red colour. It has a strong, hard texture and it is good for water storage.

Geographical area

The production area of Ban Mon pottery is in NakhonSawan province, located in the upper-central area of Thailand.

Production/processing

Link between product and territory

Two hundred years ago, the Mon people, an ancient tribe, migrated from Pak Kret district, Nonthaburi province and Sam Khok district, PathumThani province, bringing with them the local wisdom of making clay-based pottery. After having settled in NakornSawan province, they found that the clay in the area was also appropriate for making pottery using their traditional knowledge. With some adaptations over time, the people in NakornSawan province now produce this distinct pottery, which is of a fine quality, out of this clay.
